Impacts

Enhanced student interest in research

• We focused on promoting excellence in research by inspiring students into clinical academia. We enhanced scholarship programmes, which nurture future clinical academics with the aim of addressing local shortages of clinical academics. This is evidenced by increased numbers of AFP applicants from the UoA.

INSPIRE is coordinated by the Academy of Medical Sciences and supported by the Wellcome Trust. INSPIRE activities are designed and delivered locally by individual medical schools.







Student Public Engagement

• With Aberdeen Student Society for Academic Medicine, we provided support to run two TechFest events. This provided exposure to public engagement for students who are future academics. As a key partner in the local outcome improvement plan, UoA's engagement with the public impacts the North of Scotland with the vision "a place where all people can prosper".
