Implemented Activities

Summer Research Project

- 5 INSPIRE-funded research studentships were undertaken
- We supported projects in areas ranging from informing policy, linking anatomy to disease risk, to understanding development of anti-microbial resistance.
- Having the INSPIRE funds already in place, allowed us to have introductory mixer event, allowing students to meet supervisors and understand more about the process of applying for external funds.

Conference Travel

 Funding from this year's scheme has supported attendance to present and network at conferences. We were also able to support a student to attend a global precision medicine network meeting in New York, USA. The meeting was an extremely positive experience, leading directly to PhD studies for the student.

Student and Alumni Career Mentoring

- We have continued to mediate alumni mentoring and careers advice as well as outreach activities, opening up avenues to a diverse range of careers within and outside veterinary medicine and challenging the real and perceived barriers to these careers.
- Outreach activities have sought to challenge the real and perceived barriers to becoming a veterinary surgeon and engaging with research. These activities have equipped students with professional insights and skills to not only succeed within the professional environment, but also to offer informed opinion on current policy.

Having continuing INSPIRE funds has allowed us to be consistent in what we have been able to offer and to build upon our successes. Examples of student feedback:
