Implemented Activities

Summer Studentships

- Students are awarded a stipend to cover living cost while they complete a research project.
- Students are required to work together with a supervisor to devise a research project which has local impact.

CARD (Critical Appraisal and Research Design) Course

- Teaching provided by university academics and covered a wide range of topics, from study design to statistical analysis.
- The aim is to equip students with the basic skills and confidence to undertake research projects semi-independently.
- The CARD course has been running for 5 years, and continues to grow in popularity. The course runs one evening a week for 10 weeks in the winter term, and is open to students from all years.

Impacts

Raising the profile of academic medicine

 Numerous successfully attended events within and outside the curriculum with demonstrable impact of raising profile of academic medicine

Academic Foundation Programme

Conversion of 69% success rate to the Academic Foundation Programme in 2018

Presenting and publishing research

Survey of the 2018 graduate cohort (150 surveys returned) identified that further
to this, 23% had presented findings at a local meeting, 19% at a national
conference, 7% at an international conference and 5% had achieved publication
with over 16% having submitted papers.

INSPIRE is coordinated by the Academy of Medical Sciences and supported by the Wellcome Trust. INSPIRE activities are designed and delivered locally by individual medical schools.
