Provision of Bursaries

- The provision of bursaries to support students undertaking summer research projects
- Posters summarising the research undertaken were produced and presented to their peers at an undergraduate research choice convention held on 31 October 2018, or the 3rd National Student Veterinary Research Conference on 2 November 2019

Impacts

Provision of bursaries

- The requested funding was used in the provision of bursaries to support eight students undertaking summer research projects and as such this represented the principal impact of the scheme.
- In addition a further six projects were successful in obtaining external funding.

Student research forum

- We have adopted a closer relationship with the Edinburgh One Health Society and have identified suitably driven students to take forward the student research forum.
- These students involved in the drafting and submission of our successful 2019 bid for INSPIRE funding. Lastly, a web based interface for the Research Track process has been conceptualised and designed and is shortly to be rendered live.

National Veterinary Research Conference

- Our plans for an Undergraduate Research Choice Convention developed into hosting the 3rd National Veterinary Research Conference at R(D)SVS on 2 November 2019 – a platform enabling veterinary students from every vet school in the UK to present their research.
