44 leading medical experts recognised for excellence in research

44 researchers from across the UK have been recognised for their contribution to the advancement of medical science by election to the Fellowship of the Academy of Medical Sciences.

Academy Fellows are elected for excellence in medical research, for innovative application of scientific knowledge or for their conspicuous service to healthcare. The expertise of the new Fellows spans pharmacology, cell biology, biomedical engineering, childhood cancers, suicide prevention and international health.

Professor Sir John Tooke PMedSci, President of the Academy of Medical Sciences said, 'The Academy of Medical Sciences exists to promote the best of medical science for the benefit of society. Our new Fellows are recognised for their exceptional contribution and collectively represent the array of talent present in the UK medical science community. They will further strengthen the Academy and I look forward to working with them over the coming years.'

One new Fellow, Professor Jon Nicholl, is Professor of Health Services Research and Dean of the School of Health and Related Research (ScHARR) at the University of Sheffield. He has been recognised for his research into emergency and urgent first contact care, specialising in A and E services.

Also elected in 2013, Professor Andrew Prentice directs the MRC International Nutrition Group based at the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine (LSHTM). His research focuses on the connections between early-life nutrition and health problems in developing countries, with a major portion of the work centred around the group's clinical laboratories at MRC Keneba in rural Gambia. He is a member of The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation's Global Health Discovery Expert Group.

Another of the new Fellows, Professor Rebecca Fitzgerald, a gastroenterologist at the MRC Cancer Cell Unit, Hutchison/MRC Research Centre in Cambridge, originally made contact with the Academy by joining its career mentoring scheme. She has now become the first Academy mentee to be elected to the Fellowship.

Professor Fitzgerald said: "The Academy mentoring scheme enabled me to link up with a senior clinician scientist at an early stage in my independent research career. I have valued their encouragement and advice immensely as I have tried to build an innovative translational research career alongside clinical and family commitments. I am thrilled to have been elected a Fellow."

This year, twelve (27%) of the new Fellows are women, almost double the percentage of female Professors in the biosciences.*

Earlier in 2013, the Academy released the report "Representation of women within the Academy's Fellowship", which scrutinised the nomination and election process for gender balance and equality.

Sir John said, "It is particularly pleasing to see that once again women are strongly represented in the newly elected Fellows."

The new Fellows will be formally admitted to the Academy at a ceremony on Wednesday 26 June 2013.

Three nominators from within the Fellowship must back each candidate. The Academy Registrar, Professor Moira Whyte, Professor of Respiratory Medicine, University of Sheffield, oversees the election.

The election brings the number of Fellows to 1095.
