

Nominations for Academy of Medical Sciences Council election 2025

About Council

Council plays a fundamental role in the governance and decision-making of the Academy, overseeing our strategic plan and guiding the organisation on how it should respond to key issues and events.

The fact that the majority of Council members are elected by our current Fellows gives Council the mandate to speak on behalf of the Fellowship and the Academy is therefore keen to ensure that Council reflects the full breadth and diversity of its Fellowship. We strive to ensure that no individual or group is treated more or less favourably than others on the grounds of ethnicity, age, disability, sex, gender, marital status, sexual orientation, religion or belief. Our definition of diversity expands beyond protected characteristics to include geography, research focus, sector, clinical or non-clinical specialties, career stage and socioeconomic background.

Further points to note about Council include:

- Council are the Trustees of the Academy as a registered charity
- Council is collectively responsible for the management of the Academy in accordance with charity legislation.
- Council directs the policy of the Academy and manages all matters concerning Academy business, delegating the management of such business to the Officers, employees or external advisers, as it sees fit.
- Council members serve the Academy in a personal capacity and not as representatives of their affiliated institutions.
- In order to promote transparency, it is Academy policy to collect, maintain and publish a
 Register of Interests for its Trustees. Council members are required to complete an
 annual Declaration of Interests form and update this as necessary during their term of
 office.
- The Academy records diversity data for all its main decision-making committees and is committed to publishing this openly each year on our website. A current breakdown of diversity data for Council is provided below.
- Council meets 5 times a year.

The 2025 election

Eligibility and nomination requirements

- All Ordinary Fellows of the Academy are eligible to stand for election to the Academy's Council provided that - should they have previously served on Council - at least one calendar year must have passed since they ceased to hold office.
- Nominations for Council must be supported by **three Fellows** and accompanied by a personal statement from the candidate in support of the nomination. Guidance on completing the candidate statement is provided below.
- Electronic signatures are acceptable.

- Currently serving Academy Honorary Officers and the Ordinary members of Council being replaced through this election **are not eligible to support nominations**.
- Self-nomination is accepted provided that the nomination is supported by the requisite three supporting signatures.
- Nominees must be aware of their nomination, have been approached by nominators and must have expressed a willingness and ability to serve on Council if elected. They must be aware that, if elected, they will take on the responsibilities of Trustees of the Academy under charity legislation.

Vacancies for 2025 and nominations deadline

- Two new Council Members will be appointed via this year's election.
- Voting materials will include photos and the candidate statements submitted on nomination forms and will be circulated to the Fellowship in early October.
- The closing date for receipt of nominations is 17.00 on Monday 8 September 2025.

Period of service on Council and induction

- Ordinary Council Members serve for a period of three years.
- Incoming Council members will be provided with an induction session following the February 2026 Council meeting (dates provided below).

The 2025 election timetable

- Candidate nominations must be received by 17.00 on Monday 8 September.
- The election will take place online through a ballot platform administered by Civica Election Services. Fellows will receive their voting instructions by email.
- Voting will open on Wednesday 1 October 2025.
- The deadline for voting will be 17:00 on Thursday 6 November 2025.
- The single transferable voting system will be used to determine the outcome of the election and the ballot will be counted on **Friday 7 November 2025**.
- The results of the election will be announced at the AGM on 3 December 2025.

Guidance on what to include in the candidate statement

Candidates are requested to use this statement to emphasise how they might contribute to the Academy if elected and to outline any experience or expertise which might be of particular relevance to the role, providing evidence or examples as appropriate.

- Of which remaining in role for 2026: 11 White/European, 1 Asian, 2 prefer not to say


Disability:
