FORUM Annual Lecture: genome editing for rare disease (September 2019)

With a keynote given by Dr John Leonard, Intellia Therapeutics, supported by a panel of experts discussing how genome editing technologies could provide life-changing treatments for a range of rare, genetic diseases, and help us better understand the human genome.

Healthy ageing conference (February 2020)

A two-day conference held with the Royal Society to explore new understandings of ageing processes and ageing related diseases, and to put them in the context of what ageing means for society, policy, the economy and the health and social care systems.

Multimorbidity: a new research pathway (March 2020)

A workshop in partnership with the MRC and the NIHR exploring how interventions for multimorbid conditions can be informed through new cross-disciplinary and translational research pathways.

Public and patient involvement in research (May 2020)

A workshop in partnership with the ABPI, NIHR and AMRC exploring how PPI might be embedded into research programmes across the entire translational research pathway for medicines and other therapies.

Translation of chronic pain research (June 2020)

In partnership with Versus Arthritis, the British Neuroscience Association and the Physiological Society, this workshop will explore how we might reinvigorate therapy discovery programmes for chronic pain through new sources of evidence.
