



We help researchers to work with academia, charities, the public, policy makers and industry to make the greatest difference to health




OUR STRENGTHS

OUR STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

Our strategy will deliver the following strategic priorities over the next 10 years

- 1. We will influence policy and practice to improve the lives of patients, the public and communities by:
- Tackling the most significant health challenges in our society including health inequalities, climate change, mental health and global health security
- Ensuring research is a priority in the NHS and social care; promoting a greater focus on preventing ill-health and working with communities
- Influencing policy to improve health and strengthen research by bringing together our Fellows, researchers, partners and the public as well as other disciplines such as engineering, social and environmental science

- 2. We will support UK biomedical and health research to strengthen its global competitiveness and reputation by:
- Harnessing our rich heritage of discovery and translational science that has been fundamental to tackling the Covid-19 pandemic
- Championing transdisciplinary research across the NHS, social care and public health; academia; charities and industry - including the opportunities arising from health technology, data and artificial intelligence
- Fostering a research community that is trusted, open, diverse, collaborative and inclusive








OUR STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

- Ensuring biomedical and health research has a clear, effective and attractive career pathway

- Growing our European and global partnerships and their reach
- Extending the influence of the Academy's policy work
- Enabling more international researchers to access our career support

- Worked with health and social care partners across the UK to increase the focus of Government on prevention, public health and communities
- Developed agile, timely and effective policy responses to issues that matter to medical sciences, patients and the public
- Increased the Academy's profile with the public as an independent and trusted voice, helping people make decisions about their health
- Supported researchers to become trusted communicators in their communities and with patients, the public and policy makers

To support UK biomedical and health research to strengthen its global competitiveness and reputation we will have:

- Influenced Government and industry to support research and innovation with sustained investment
- Built key skills in the research community through the Academy's innovative career schemes and support
- Established Academy hubs and networks in the devolved nations and English regions to connect and support biomedical and health researchers to work collaboratively
- Enabled and supported more productive collaboration between the NHS, academia, industry, and patients and the public











OUR COMMITMENTS

To support the next generation of researchers to reach their full potential we will have:

- Evolved our Fellowship to be diverse, relevant and energetic in meeting the needs of the biomedical and health profession and the society it represents
- Expanded our grant schemes and programmes so that more researchers of all backgrounds can benefit from them
- Furthered our ground-breaking work on team science to promote a supportive research culture that recognises the contributions of everyone involved
- Given the voice of emerging research leaders greater influence within the Academy

To increase the Academy's impact on global health we will have:

- Made our most successful emerging research leader schemes accessible to international researchers, including those in Lower- and Middle- Income Countries
- Expanded the range and reach of our international collaborations to build research capacity and support research careers
- Connected with a diverse range of people and professionals in our global activities, actively seeking inclusion of those underrepresented in the countries we work in
- Demonstrated our commitment to equitable partnerships







OUR COMMITMENTS

As an organisation we will have:

- Diversified our funding and developed new opportunities for income generation
- Invested in our London base to achieve the greatest value for our Fellows and beneficiaries, while looking for opportunities to expand regionally
- Continued to put health and wellbeing at the heart of our organisational values and culture

- Put in place a climate crisis plan by 2024 for becoming net zero including clear targets covering our operations, reporting publicly on progress in our annual report
- Expanded our commitment to public involvement in our decisions and activities

- Ways of working that demonstrate agility, innovation, efficiency and environmental sustainability
